A good **education** is the foundation for success in all areas of life. So we place special emphasis on it to ensure that Muskingum, Perry, and Morgan Counties' youth have the best possible chance to thrive.

- During FY2010, 199 students have received 2343 hours of service from Morgan Behavioral Health Services. Over half of the students showed either significant or slight improvement in academic underachievement, acting out behavior, or poor social/peer relations.
- Muskingum County Literacy Council has distributed approximately 3,000 free books and close to 100 students will receive tutoring in the ABLE classrooms and county schools.
- During FY2010, Eastside Community Ministry taught 185 life skill lessons on housing and money management to 39 students.
- Girl Scouts taught 1,671 girls to plan and make decisions, solve problems, try new skills, work on community service projects, to learn about various career options, and to share new skills and knowledge with others during FY2010.
- Zanesville Civic League's after school and summer day camp helped 31 youth with 710 hours combined in homework help, tutoring, life skills, health, fitness, reading, and other activities for whole life learning. These 31 youth were among the 4,683 unique visitors to the center in FY2010.
- Boy Scouts had 165 rank advancements earned including 9 Eagle Scouts and 778 merit badges, and 1,908 days of camping in FY2010. The Cub Scouts had 1,416 days of camping and 391 rank advancements, including 58 earning the first year achievement, Tiger Cub Scout.
- Big Brothers Big Sisters of Perry County served 108 individuals through community and school based programs during FY2010.
- Big Brothers Big Sisters of Zanesville, during FY2010, served 462 children in one-to-one mentoring programs and 70% of these "Littles" had improved academic performance.

~~NEARING THE ENDS~~ MEET

We believe that everyone who works hard deserves to earn enough **income** to support their family. So we work with a number of partners in the community that give our tri-county region a chance to improve their skills and acquire new ones.

- Catholic Social Services was able to ensure that 100% of Payee clientele had all of their essential living needs met during FY2010. Of these individuals 82% were able to create a savings reserve to promote their financial self-sufficiency.
- Financial Stability Partnership served 400 clients, completed 809 federal and state tax returns, gave over 580 hours of time, for \$686,590 in refunds in our tri-county region.
- The Muskingum Family Y provided \$5,500 in membership assistance for summer access to Park Central in FY2010.
- Through The Salvation Army's Homeless Prevention program, 25 households have learned various budgeting skills and assisted 39 people in finding a permanent residence and 46 in obtaining employment.

~~UNHEALTHY~~

Without a healthy body and mind, you can't expect to be able to maintain a job or a home. So the United Way of Muskingum, Perry, and Morgan Counties provide resources to critical programs that help our tri-county region's families get on the path to healthier living.

- American Red Cross collected 4,832 units of blood during 317 blood drives and have trained 6,766 individuals in CPR/First Aid during 778 classes.
- Christ's Table delivered 37,809 meals during FY2010 and served 54,901 meals in their dining room. A survey was completed by homebound participants in April 2011, 75% confirmed Christ's Table's delivered meal was their main meal of the day.
- During FY2010, 38 elderly individuals received 2,965 hours of homemaker assistance through the Morgan County Senior Center.
- Eastside Community Ministry provided groceries for 20,394 meals to 2,266 individuals during FY2010.
- During FY2010, 800 unique individuals participated in the Muskingum Family Y youth sports programs.
- 2-1-1 provided food pantry assistance to 3,340 callers during FY2010.
